



COPY SERVICES: *Hamilton: PIP* about six blocks west of the Hamiltonian. Ask for specific directions at the hotel desk.

Middletown: Services are available at the Towne Mall, Meijer's, and other locations. Ask at the Holiday Inn desk.

Oxford: There is a coin-operated machine in the Shriver Center. Also: Oxford Copy Shop & Typing Pool, 10 South Poplar (523-3636; off High Street behind Attractions Restaurant), and Kinko's, 33 East High (523-1995, near Attractions, on High Street)

LIBRARY SERVICES: *Hamilton*: Lane Public Library, North 3rd and Buckeye (about five blocks northeast of Hamiltonian).

Oxford: Miami University's King Library, located on the west side of campus, and the Lane Public Library-Oxford Branch, 15 South College Avenue.

Cincinnati: University of Cincinnati College of Law Library (ask for directions).

Middletown to Shriver Center...... 35 minutes Hamiltonian to Holiday Inn...... 15 minutes

ARRIVING AT THE MIAMI CAMPUS ON FRIDAY: As you arrive at the Shriver Center, it is important that you NOT unload your evidence from your vehicle. Only the announcements and continental breakfast will be held in the Shriver Center Friday morning. You will be (unfortunately) spread out all over campus for the 9:00 a.m. round. Park your vehicle and go to Shriver's Multi-Purpose room on the main floor. There you will find a continental breakfast and announcements. After the announcements, you may drive to your rooms. Park anywhere on campus except tow-away zones, fire hydrants, or handicapped zones. If you get a ticket in a regular campus lot, bring it to Dr. Rhodes. Here you will find most of the fast food establishments including KFC, Burger King, Sisters Fried Chicken, Taco Bell, Frisch's, and Ponderosa. A satisfactory "sit down" meal is provided at Bill Knapp's.

Middletown:

Middletown has some good restaurants. Locations are a bit obscure; so ask Dr. Rhodes for directions to Schiavone's, The Meadows, or The Manchester.

Across the interstate from the Holiday Inn of Middletown there is a large cluster of acceptable restaurants, including *Bill Knapp's*, *Ponderosa*, *Bob Evans*, and *Hardee's*. Probably the best of these is *Mark Pi's China Gate*, a highly satisfactory Chinese restaurant with full lounge facilities.

On the same side of the highway as the hotel is McDonald's, and the Holiday Inn Coffee Shop is in the hotel itself.


