Directions to Campus

From any of the tournament hotels, take Glenstone north. Take Glenstone to Grand. Turn left (west) on Grand. Grand runs on the south side of campus. After driving past the football stadium, turn right (north) on to John Q. Hammons Parkway. Enter the first parking lot on the left. The competition buildings surround this parking lot. The drive should be about 15 minutes on Saturday and Sunday. It may be as long as 25 minutes on Monday.

Ballot Tables

Ballot tables will be located in each of the competition room buildings. The ballot tables will be on the first floor of each building.

Team Photographs

Team photographs will be taken between rounds on Sunday and Monday.

Library

Meyer Library will be open at 7:30 am each day of the tournament. The library has graciously agreed to be open during spring break for the National Debate Tournament. The library will be open from 7:30 am until 6:00 pm each day of the tournament. The library is across the street from Glass Hall. A coffee shop also will be open in the library each day. On Saturday and Sunday, this will be the only on campus food and snacks available which is not provided by the tournament.

Computers

Computers are available in the Meyer Library. Computers are NOT assigned to schools. Each school will be provided with a name tag for using a computer. A school should use no more than ONE COMPUTER at any time. Please download your materials and print them on your own computers. A limited number of ethernet connections are available on campus. These are in the library and the competition buildings. If you are using an ethernet connection, that will count as your use of a computer in the library.

Competition Rooms

Debates will be held in the Public Affairs Classroom Building and in Glass Hall. We have received special permission to use these buildings and ask that you cooperate in observing the rules. **FOOD AND DRINKS ARE PROHIBITED IN GLASS HALL.** Several of the rooms have computers and other equipment. Please do not use or try to use the computers or equipment.

Breakfasts, Lunches and Receptions

Breakfasts and lunches will be served in the Ballroom on the third floor of the Plaster Student Union. The reception will be held in the Student Reading Room of the Meyer Library.

Reading of Pairings

Pairings will be read in the Plaster Student Union in the Ballroom on the third floor. Tournament announcements will be made prior to the reading of the pairings.

Photocopying

Photocopying is available at Office Max (3500 S Glenstone, south of the Clarion on Glenstone) and Kinkos (1722 S Glenstone, north of the Clarion on Glenstone). Kinkos is open 24 hours.

Identification Badges

Tournament identification badges will serve as your admission to all tournament functions, including banquets at the hotel and meals on campus. We ask that you have your identification badge with you at all times. Many of our workers are volunteers who are not otherwise associated with the debate community. They will not be able to recognize people who are supposed to be at the tournament. Please be courteous in your interactions with our volunteers.

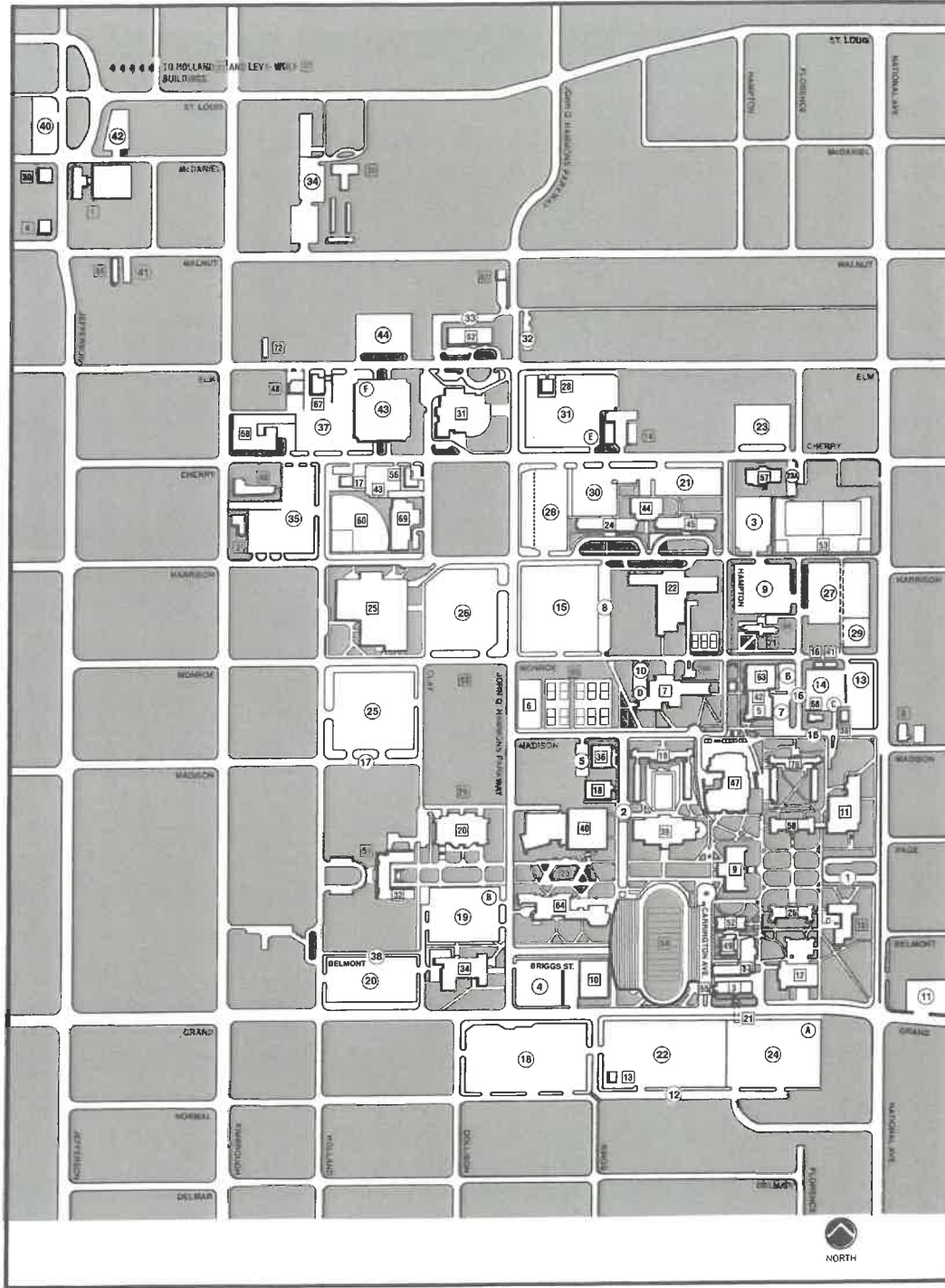
History of SMSU

Southwest Missouri State University was founded in Springfield in 1905 as the Fourth District Normal School. During its early years, the institution's primary purpose was the preparation of teachers for the public school systems in the southwest region of Missouri. The first name change came in 1919 when the school became Southwest Missouri State Teachers College, reflecting its regional mission.

By the mid-1940s, the University had expanded its instructional program beyond teacher education to include the liberal arts and sciences; and as a consequence, the Missouri legislature, in 1945, authorized an official change in the institution's name to Southwest Missouri State College. By 1972, as additional programs were implemented at the undergraduate level, and with the development of graduate education, the University had become an educationally diverse institution. Recognition of this further growth and development again resulted in an official change in name to Southwest Missouri State University. Today, the institution is a multipurpose, metropolitan university providing diverse instructional, research, and service programs.

In 1963, a residence center offering freshman and sophomore level courses was established at West Plains. Now, as a second campus of the university with its own mission, the West Plains campus offers a two-year general education program, which is fully integrated with programs on the main campus, as well as other specialty and skills courses.

The State Fruit Experiment Station, established by a legislative act in 1899, is the oldest identifiable segment of Southwest Missouri State University. Until 1974, it operated as a state agency under a board of trustees appointed by the Governor. As a result of the Omnibus State Reorganization Act of 1974, administrative responsibility for the Station was given to the Board of Regents of the University. In 1984, the Station was assigned departmental status in the College of Health and Applied Sciences as part of a reorganization of the University. The most recent university mission statement identifies the Station as a separate campus with a research designation.

History of the NDT

The National Debate Tournament began at the United States Military Academy in 1947. It was organized and conducted by the academy at West Point for its first 20 years. Initial tournament rules were determined by the West Point administration in consultation with debate coaches such as A. Craig Baird of the University of Iowa, G.M. Musgrave of Des Moines, Alan Nichols of USC, E.R. Nichols of the University of Redlands, and Joseph O'Brien of Pennsylvania State University.

At the first tournament in 1947, 20 colleges participated in five "seeding" rounds and four elimination rounds over a three-day period. Some of the features of the tournament were that no school would meet a school within five hundred miles of itself during the seeding rounds and that no coach would judge a school from his or her own district. Many traditions were started at West Point that year: the "big board", oral announcement of round pairing, cadet escorts for each team, teams for each debate meeting under banner of the affirmative team, and team signs in the rooms.

In 1967, the National Debate Tournament entered a new era as the American Forensic Association, the national professional organization of forensics educators, assumed responsibility for the tournament. The NDT was moved from West Point and has been hosted by a different school every year since, although three schools (West Georgia, Miami University of Ohio, and the University of Utah) have hosted it twice. Procedures for the tournament are determined by the NDT Committee, which is composed of one member elected from each of the nine districts and four members appointed by the AFA President. The NDT Board of Trustees is also appointed by the AFA President, and it has the responsibility of overseeing all NDT financial matters. As debate has developed in the recent years other refinements have been added to the tournament: cross examination, the 10-minute preparation time rule, elaborate procedures for assigning judges, judge qualification, and computer-assisted research stations for participating schools. Over the years, the tournament has expanded in size to a maximum of 78 teams.

In the early days, district-nominating committees chose teams. This method was replaced by some form of qualifying tournament, the tournament host and previous year's winner received automatic invitations. Post-district at-large bids were initiated in 1968, and pre-district bids in 1971. Since 1970, it has been possible for a school to qualify as many as two teams for NDT. Beginning in 1992, up to six schools can qualify a third team.

The National Debate Tournament is grateful to its corporate sponsor, the Ford Motor Company Fund. The NDT is also indebted to Mr. Sigurd S. Larmon (1891-1987) for donating the rotating Larmon Trophy, emblematic of the national debate championship; to Mr. and Mrs. George Walker for donating the rotating second-placer Walker Memorial Trophy in memory of their son; to Mr. Robert Feldhake, top speaker at the 1976 NDT and now an attorney in Los Angeles, for donating the Wayne Brockriede Top Speaker Award; to an anonymous individual for donating the Tiffany Bowl rotating Top Speaker Trophy; the Copeland Family for donating the Rex Copeland First Team At-Large Trophy; and to Ovid R. Davis/West Georgia College for donating the Championship Coach Award.
