2010 National Coaching Awards

The Lucy Keel Award for forensic contributors was initiated by the NDT Board of Trustees in 1996. The award honors the former Director of Debate at CSU Fullerton and member of the Board of Trustees for many years, and was created to recognize outstanding service to the Debate Community.

The George Zigelmueller Award was initiated at the 1999 NDT. Wayne State alumni endowed the award in honor of their coach, George Ziegelmueller, for his over 30 years of excellent coaching, timeless commitment to the activity and numerous contributions to the forensics community—not the least of which was saving the NDT in 1966. The award and is presented to a faculty member who has distinguished himself or herself in the communication profession while coaching teams to competitive success at the NDT. Justifiably, George was himself the first recipient.

In Memorium

ike all large communities, the debate family periodically experiences the loss of important members. Below are a few of the debate personalities who have left us this year, some after long and fruitful lives, others taken from us far too soon.

Scott Deatherage, Northwestern University — One of the most successful and influential college debate coaches of the modern era, Scott was the Director of Debate at Northwestern from 1990—2008. His competitive accomplishments at Northwestern are the barometer by which future coaches will be measured. Under his tutelage, Northwestern won the National Debate Tournament seven times, and four Northwestern debaters were named Top Speaker at the NDT. He was voted Coach of the Decade for the 1990s by his peers. A tireless advocate for debate around the nation, Scott became the Deputy Director of the National Association for Urban Debate Leagues in 2008. His countless students and friends in the community will remember him as an inspirational mentor and a fierce competitor.



"Coach" Doug Duke, University of Central Oklahoma — Professor Duke coached forensics and debate at UCO for five decades from 1967 to 2005. At Central Oklahoma, he produced several national champions in a variety of formats, most notably the CEDA National Tournament Champions of 1990 and the National Junior Debate Tournament Champions of 1996. He served as president of the Cross Examination Debate Association and won both the Brownlee and the Pelham, the two most respected awards bestowed to collegiate debate coaches by their fellow outstanding peers. Coach Duke produced scores of forensics educators, NDT and CEDA Elimination Round Qualifiers, tournament champions, attorneys, professors and business people. He literally wrote the book when he supervised the development and writing of PATHWAYS, the standardized curriculum guide on which Oklahoma's high schools base their Communication, Speech and Debate courses' content.



Dr. John Gossett, University of Houston, University of Northern Iowa, University of North Texas — A lifelong force for debate in the Southwest, Dr. Gossett was the Director of Debate at UNT from 1981–1991. During that time, he rebuilt the North Texas debate program to be a perennial qualifier for the NDT. Under his leadership, the team won twenty intercollegiate debate tournaments. Dr. Gossett served on the NDT Committee from 1982–1990, and was a member of the NDT Board of Trustees from 1992–2002. He was the Chair of the Board for four years during that period.

Dr. Frank Harrison, Trinity University — One of the great gentlemen of college debate, Dr. Harrison was the face of Trinity debate for nearly twenty years. He served as Director of Debate at Trinity from 1988–2006, reestablishing the the program upon his arrival at the university and guiding Trinity to consistent national-level competition. A former Captain in the U.S. Air Force and a member of the U.S. House of Representatives in the early 1980s, Dr. Harrison was deeply involved with several academic organizations related to speech and debate including serving as president of the American Debate Association.

Ross Smith, Wake Forest University — Ross was the longtime Wake Forest debate coach and Director of Debate (1985–2009) who led the squad to two national championships. A true icon of the college debate community, he was responsible for many modern debate innovations, including the 9-3-6 speech time format. Ross was named National Coach of the Year in 1994 and 1998, and District VI Coach of the Year in 2000 and 2006. In Best of the Decade polling he was named Best Judge of the 1990's and Second Best Coach of the 1990's. He qualified more teams to the elimination rounds of the National Debate Tournament than any other coach in the last decade. He was the 2009 winner of the George Ziegelmueller Award.
