



2011 National Coaching Awards

The Lucy Keel Award for forensic contributors was initiated by the NDT Board of Trustees in 1996. The award honors the former Director of Debate at CSU Fullerton and member of the Board of Trustees for many years, and was created to recognize outstanding service to the Debate Community.

The George Zigelmueller Award was initiated at the 1999 NDT. Wayne State alumni endowed the award in honor of their coach, George Zigelmueller, for his over 30 years of excellent coaching, timeless commitment to the activity and numerous contributions to the forensics community—not the least of which was saving the NDT in 1966. The award is presented to a faculty member who has distinguished himself or herself in the communication profession while coaching teams to competitive success at the NDT. Justifiably, George was himself the first recipient.






Copeland Award (Top First Round At-Large Team)


In Memorium

Like all large communities, the debate family periodically experiences the loss of important members. Below are a few of the debate personalities who have left us this year, some after long and fruitful lives, others taken from us far too soon.

Vince Binder, University of West Georgia and Florida State University — Vince was a successful and popular debater at West Georgia. During his senior year he reached elimination rounds at every tournament he attended, including sweeping the UNLV Round Robin and invitational tournament, debating in the finals at Northwestern, and debating in the semifinals at Wake Forest. That year Vince and his partner received a first round bid to the NDT. He reached elimination rounds at both collegiate National tournaments and placed 3rd at CEDA nationals. Vince was also recognized as one of the most social and friendly debaters on the circuit. After graduating, Vince was accepted into the M.A. in Rhetoric program at Florida State University, where he served as the University's Debate Coach until his tragic death.



Mark DeLoach, University of North Texas — Mark debated in college for the University of Texas at Arlington and went on to a notable career as a debate coach and mentor at USC, Northern Arizona University, and the University of North Texas. He eventually became a tenured professor at UNT, where he was a strong advocate for his students and for debate. Mark left UNT to become a principal with Leadership Research Institute, where he was among the most valued and respected in his firm.





1947-1948 RESOLVED: That a federal world government should be established.

1948-1949 RESOLVED: That the federal government should adopt a policy of equalizing educational opportunity in tax-supported schools by means of annual grants.

1949-1950 RESOLVED: That the United States should nationalize the basic nonagricultural industries.

1950-1951 RESOLVED: That the non-communist nations should form a new international organization.

1951-1952 RESOLVED: That the federal government should adopt a permanent program of wage and price control.

1952-1953 RESOLVED: That the Congress of the United States should enact a compulsory fair employment practices law.

1953-1954 RESOLVED: That the United States should adopt a policy of free trade.

1954-1955 RESOLVED: That the United States should extend diplomatic recognition to the communist government of China.

1955-1956 RESOLVED: That the nonagricultural industries should guarantee their employees an annual wage.

1956-1957 RESOLVED: That the United States should discontinue direct economic aid to foreign countries.

1957-1958 RESOLVED: That the requirement of membership in a labor organization as a condition of employment should be illegal.

1958-1959 RESOLVED: That the further development of nuclear weapons should be prohibited by international agreement.

1986-1987 RESOLVED: That one or more presently existing restrictions on First Amendment freedoms of press and/or speech established in one or more federal court decisions should be curtailed or prohibited.

1987-1988 RESOLVED: That the United States should reduce substantially its military commitments to NATO member states.

1988-1989 RESOLVED: That United States foreign policy toward one or more African nations should be substantially changed.

1989-1990 RESOLVED: That the federal government should adopt an energy policy that substantially reduces nonmilitary consumption of fossil fuels in the United States.
